There's Something About Mary...No Matter Who You Are

On Sunday, August 15th, we'll take a break from Ordinary Time in the Church for the Commemoration of Mary, Mother of Our Lord. Some Lutherans sometimes do this in the Summer. The feast day itself was established in the 9th Century and a belief in the *Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary*, her bodily acceptance into Heaven, can be traced to another 400 or so years before that. However, after the dust settled on the Reformation most Lutherans set aside the belief in the Assumption...but we retained the feast day, as you might expect.

As I prepared for this day five years ago, the congregation I was serving in Ohio lost one of her most faithful and stalwart members. A humble, caring, and kind Lutheran from rural Minnesota who had been the principal actor in establishing Peace Lutheran's "legendary" rose garden some four decades prior, taught Sunday School, and raised their family in the church.

When you are serving a small family-sized congregation and a near-founding member dies, it changes the Sunday sermon; no matter the day or the text. But still I was hesitant, if only for a moment...

"Can a comparison to Mary be made?" I thought, "Tom was in the Army."

Suffice to say, I doubt Tom Walker consciously ever modeled his life after Mary. I certainly don't think he would have suspected that his non-funeral, funeral sermon would be a comparison between himself and the Mother of God. But at least according to his beloved wife Bea (+) and his friends in the church, he would have loved it. And that I don't doubt, because that's who Tom was; a man who consciously or unconsciously lived so many of the virtues of Mary in his own life; fidelity, courage, compassion. He even founded the rose garden...the term Rosary coming from *Rosarium*, rose garden; the flower associated with Mary. *Occasionally, God really just has to hit you in the nose with it!*


Sometimes, when looking for figures in the faith to learn from or emulate, we can try looking for a mirror. That's not all bad, I suppose. The closer the image, perhaps the more concrete the lesson. But we shouldn't be stymied by the differences between us and the Saints gone before nor the Saints living now when it comes to looking for examples and role models in the Lord. We might find out that Mary (any of them), Martha, or Deborah has just as much to teach a young man as John the Baptist, Solomon, and the Sons of Thunder ever will. And likewise for women, or rich, or poor, or young, or old, so on and so on. In memory of Tom and in anticipation of celebrating Mary, Mother of Our Lord, I invite each of you to find an "unusual" role model in the faith, you might be surprised what you find!

Thrivent Choice






