St. Paul Lutheran Church Volume 21 Issue 1

For centuries Christians have marked the lintels over their home's front door during the season after the Epiphany (Epiphanytide). The marking is a sign of blessing and a prayer for protection for those who dwell within or enter the house. It draws upon the marking over the doors of the Israelities during the Passover in Egypt (Exodus 12). Furthermore, it recalls the protection of our Heavenly Father for Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as the Magi (Wisemen) did not return to Herod, having been warned in a dream not to, and the visitation of an angel to Joseph in a dream telling him to flee to Egypt for safety (Matthew 2).

The marking on the lintel includes: the year, 4 crosses, and the letters C, M, B. They can be understood as initials for the traditional names ascribed to the 3 Wise Men. They can also be understood as being initials for the Latin: *Christus mansionem benedicat* = Christ bless this house.

We draw from the Wise Men's names as we mark saying:

- C Caspar
- M Melchior
- B and Balthasar followed the star of God's Son who became human
- 20 two thousand
- 22 twenty two years ago
- ++ May Christ bless our home
- ++ and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

If you would like to arrange a time for me to come by for a visit to bless the house and chalk the door, just call the church or send an email. [Blessings should customarily take place during Epiphanytide - Jan. 7th - Feb 1st.] If you plan to be there, which I hope you will, we can do it together at the front door. However, if you will not be home, simply leave a Diet Coke at the front door, so I know I'm at the right place, and

I'll happily come by. And if you would like to do this on your own you can grab some chalk and an instruction paper on the table in the Narthex the next time you come to church.

The Church Council met on December 16th. Here are some highlights of the meeting:

- Our response to Covid was discussed. One change was made: we will pass the offering plate.
- Council commended the Parking Committee for its work.
- Council will hold a retreat on January 8th to discuss a reorganization of our congregation governance.
- Annual meeting of the congregation set for February 27th. We elect new council members, and we need a new treasurer.
- Discussion of installing solar panels on the rood continued. We have information from two companies. There is a hole in the shingles near the steeple that must be repaired before this can be done. Council is also addressing several issues which have arisen related to this; we need answers before we can bring this to the congregation.
- We continue to look for a cleaning service for the building. Any input or assistance from members is welcome.



Have you the skills to be treasurer of the congregation? Debby Borrelli is moving. She has served us very well for many years, and we heartily thank her for all her work. But now we need a successor as soon as possible, so that Debby may work with that person during a transition period.

CIRCLE OF FRIENDS St. Paul MEAL COORDINATOR NEEDED!!


For the past several decades, St. Paul has been providing a meal one weekend each month to anyone in the Downtown Morgantown area. Some of the people are homeless, some have homes but have minimal cooking skills, and - until COVID restrictions – some just wanted a place to have a meal with other people. Churches and organizations in the surrounding Morgantown area provide meals on the other Saturdays and Sundays. That is why we are a "Circle of Friends"!

Our congregation has had a dedicated cadre of volunteers who provide food items, donate money for food and serving items and who serve the meals. The volunteer numbers have gotten much smaller recently due to several people moving away from Morgantown

The meal is served on the 4th full weekend Sunday at the WVU Lutheran Campus Chapel from 4—5 pm. Set up usually takes about 30-45 minutes and clean-up is usually finished by 5:15.

So the total commitment is about 2 hours! (FYI: Street parking is free downtown on Sundays.) With COVID restrictions still in place, all meals are served as "to-go meals".

Please contact the church office or Debby Borrelli, if you would be interested in coordinating this ministry of our church. If a new coordinator is not in place by the end of the year, we will notify the Circle of Friends group organizer that St. Paul will no longer participate in this ministry.





Thank you to Debby Borrelli for her years of faithful service as congregational treasurer, as coordinator of Circle of Friends, as a member of the Parking Committee, and other jobs too numerous to remember!
