
So what do you say when you're at a loss for words? ... Back to first things!

"As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, ² in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. ³ All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our flesh and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of wrath. 4 But because of his great love for us. God, who is rich in mercy, ⁵

made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. ⁶ And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, 7 in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. 8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— 9 not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰ For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. (Ephesians 2:1-10)

When the search for new and clever words fail, the recalling of the Gospel never will.

Donate *money:* If you would like to donate money, please note "Food Baskets" on your check or offering envelope and place it in the offering basket.


We will use cash donations to purchase dry milk, gift cards for turkeys, and items not donated in kind.

You may wish to sponsor flowers for an anniversary, a birthday, or in memory of a loved one.


