#### A Word from Pastor Tony

**Its been a rainy week here in town.** One of those weeks that makes you wonder if the sun will ever shine again with the same brilliance you strain to remember. Rain and clouds are often used as metaphors. Usually it's negative, but not always. Jesus says it rains on the just and the unjust alike. In an agrarian society like 1st Century Judea, that rain was likely understood as a blessing. The truth of this teaching stands no matter how we perceive the metaphorical rains in our own lives. I've been good, that means I should get good. I've been bad, which means I should get bad. That's the way it should work, right?

Often in the midst of the rains we go searching for the reason in our own lives. We can *sometimes* bring ill on ourselves, and a searching moral inventory is never out of place; however, often the road to hell is paved with trying to blame ourselves for the pains of this life that are unavoidable and undeserved. Doing so has a nasty habit of digging away at one's faith. So, remember the Sun will shine again and, when it doesn't, <u>always</u> remember that God is puddle-hopping alongside you every step of the way. Easter Blessings!
